

Gauber Bunk Barn

Information about your stay

-Our water supply comes from a nearby borehole. The water is tested annually by Craven District Council and is safe to drink. If you would prefer to drink bottled water we do have bottles available for purchase.

Our water passes through a UV filtration system. At times, (usually after heavy rainfall) the filters can become blocked and cause a drop in water pressure. Please let us know as soon as possible if you notice a drop in water pressure and we will change the filter, it takes 2 minutes!

- A septic tank collects waste from the barn and Den. Please do not put any products other than toilet paper down the toilet.

-Gauber Bunk Barn is an old building. Some of the stairs in the barn are uneven and some of the doorways are quite low.

-All the bunk beds are designed to sleep adults and children, however the top bunks are not suitable for children under the age of 6 years. The maximum weight for each bunk bed is 17 stones.

- Fitted sheets, pillows and pillowcases are provided. Guests are welcome to bring their own sleeping bags/duvets and towels, alternatively duvets and towels are available to hire for a one off charge of £7 per person.

-A travel cot and high chair are available on request. Please bring your own bedding for the cot bed.

-There is a Smart TV in the living room.

-Free Wi-Fi is available however due to our rural location it can be intermittent at times.

-There is no mobile signal in the immediate area.

-The kitchen is equipped with a double oven, 4 ring electric hob, microwave oven, fridge/freezer, kettle, toaster, dishwasher and washing machine. Cutlery, crockery, pots, pans and serving dishes are all available for guests to use.

- A starter pack of logs/kindling and coal is included in the price. Additional logs etc.. are available to buy on-site, please ask.

- A self service breakfast basket consisting of cereals, bread, eggs, juice, bananas, tea, coffee and milk can be provided for an additional charge. Please order in advance and notify us of any allergies or dietary requirements, thank you.

-We have a drying room/bike store available for guests to use.

-We have an area of free parking outside the barn and Den. Please consider other guests when parking and please do not park in the area marked 'Den Parking', thank you.

-We do not have a provision for charging electric cars at Gauber. The nearest EV charging station is at Booths supermarket in Kirkby Lonsdale.

-The nearest pub the Station Inn, Ribbleshead, Tel 01524 241274 is a 15 min road walk from Gauber. Please be aware there is no path or street lighting.

-There's also a number of restaurants and pubs in Ingleton (15 min drive from Gauber). If you would prefer to bring your own food the barn has a well equipped kitchen. During the summer months we have a BBQ available for guests to use in the garden to the rear of the barn(charcoal is not provided).

-If you wish to make an online grocery order Tesco, Asda, Sainsbury's and Morrisons deliver to this area. When giving directions please instruct them we are on the B6479 and not at Salt Lake Cottages! We have a clear Gauber Bunk Barn sign on the grass verge.

- We provide a grocery service for guests who require a small amount of items. Please provide us with a list of items you require a couple of days prior to your stay and we will ensure the items are in the barn for when you arrive. Payment for these items can be made on departure.

-Gauber Bunk Barn & Den are in a rural location. The nearest shops can be found in Ingleton(15 min drive from Gauber). There are a number of small shops including a Co-op, petrol station, pharmacy, newsagent, outdoor shop and a number of restaurants, pubs and takeaways. Please be aware that none of our local restaurants offer a delivery service to our area.
